Just to re-cap


- Growth in exports from Asia affecting manufacture and trade in UN/ECE
- Production remained stable in 2002 after fall in 2001
- Apparent consumption fell 6% in EU/EFTA, but rose 6% in "Other Europe" sub-region
- Trade in dimension continues to grow
- Romanian exports rose 21% in 2002
- Hardwood flooring in EU levelled off in 2002
- Demand for certified sawn grew in 2002/3 but availability is in question

"It is now very clear that 2000 was a peak year"


2. Shift in species preference

- Measured return to darker species
- An end to the blonde wood trend in Europe
- Increased consumption of tropical species in flooring
- Return to fashion for oak


3. Exchange rate dynamics

- Improvement of the Euro
 - Strengthens competition from imports:
 - USA
 - Asia


Sawn consumption 96-02




Flooring EU 2002

Certified sawn hardwood

- Pressure from ENGOs continues
- Producers are responding
- PEFC and SFI still seek mutual recognition with other credible schemes such as FSC
- Availability in species, grades and specifications in dry sawn stock remains too limited
- Demand from private and public sectors differ significantly
